- Fit for the Future Award New award for 2023 This accolade celebrates an incredible marketing initiative at club or county level, which has led to a growth in participation or has increased exposure for our sport. Particular focus will be on clubs who made bowls more diverse and inclusive.
- Club of the Year, sponsored by Sutton Winson This award celebrates clubs that have made the most significant contribution over the last 12 months across all facets of club management and development.
- **Team of the Year** recognises the team that has performed admirably on the green over the past 12 month, at national, county or club level. That could be a team of any size, from Pairs all the way up to a Middleton or Johns.
- **Greenkeeper of the Year, sponsored by Dennis Mowers and SISIS** surfaces are critical for the enjoyment of bowlers and the growth of our sport. This prize will be awarded to a greenkeeper at an affiliated club who has done outstanding work on their green.

- **Unsung Hero** Our sport is full of people who work tirelessly behind the scenes. This accolade will recognise someone who has contributed impressively to any area of voluntary activity to support the delivery of our sport over the last 12 months.
